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How much is the Compulsory Student Services Fee?

The Compulsory Student Services Fee (CSSF) supports a wide range of services designed to enhance your experience at NMIT. These services foster a supportive and inclusive environment, helping students achieve academic success and personal well-being.

What is the CSSF?

The CSSF is a non-tuition fee charged to NMIT students based on their study load (credits). It helps fund student support services and activities as outlined by the <u>Tertiary Education Commission (TEC)</u>, ensuring services meet the needs of all students while complying with government guidelines.

For 2025, a 6% fee increase has been determined to maintain and improve current service levels.

| Year | Fee per credit | Full-time fee (120 credits) |

| 2024 | \$2.05 | \$246.00 |
| 2025 | \$2.17 | \$260.76 |

The fee is subject to annual review, and NMIT actively consults students on how these funds are allocated. Apprentices and trainees can opt out of paying this fee.

What can the CSSF be spent on?

At NMIT, the CSSF funds services across Tertiary Education Commission (TEC)-approved categories:

- Advocacy and Legal Advice
- Careers Information, Advice, and Guidance
- Counselling Services
- Employment Information and Services
- Financial Support and Advice
- Health Services
- Clubs, Societies, Sports, and Recreation
- Childcare Services
- Media
- Sport, Recreation, and Cultural Activities

Where does the money go?

In 2023, \$347,200 was collected in Compulsory Student Services Fees and \$518,800 was distributed against the approved categories:
