The minimum specifications we require are:

- Windows 11 Operating System
- Intel i5 or AMD Ryzen 5 processor
- 16GB of memory
- 500GB+ NVMe SSD
- 1Gbps Ethernet port or purchase an adapter if needed for network courses
- 802.11n wireless
- Webcam

Additional Requirements

256 GB Internal SSD, 2.5" form factor, SATA 3 interface - you will need one or two per course, depending on your course selection.
