The minimum specifications we require are:

- Windows 11 Operating System, or Windows 10 Operating System but this will not be supported by Microsoft from October 2025.
- Intel i5 or AMD A8 processor
- 16GB of memory
- 500GB+ hard drive
- 1Gbps Ethernet port or purchase adapter if needed for network courses
- 802.11n wireless
- Webcam
- SSD - 128GB Internal SSD

Discrete graphics are not mandatory but are strongly suggested as there are several aspects of the degree which can require considerable graphics power.

Can I use an Apple product?
